

Winnipeg Regional Health Authority supports the Hope Centre (health centre immediately outside of the 21 blocks) and Mount Carmel Clinic, outside the designated area in Lord Selkirk Park which also serves individuals and families in the designated area. The Health Authority is also a partner and delivers services out of Win Gardner Place (see below).

### 3.2 Key Assets Adjacent to the 21 Block Area

It should be noted that there are additional, significant assets within the neighbourhoods adjacent to the 21 block area. Such primary assets that are often accessed by the Aboriginal community include:

- ✓ Win Gardner Place on McGregor Street and College Avenue which contains a Ma Mawi Wi Chi Itata community care site and youth programming, SPLASH Child Care, YMCA / YWCA run gymnasium, games area, climbing wall and skate board area, as well as community meeting rooms and the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority's public health office.
- ✓ Several child care centres such as Action Day Care on Dufferin, SPLASH Child Care sites on Burrows and at Win Gardner Place, Ann Ross Day Care.
- ✓ Hope Health Care centre which provides primary medical health care and social supports.
- ✓ Mount Carmel Clinic which provides primary medical health care, child development supports, social work / counselling, dental services and a pharmacy.
- ✓ Native Women's Transition Centre which provides emergency and transitional housing for Aboriginal women leaving abusive situations, along with a culture based series of supports.
- ✓ Memengwaa Place, which functions as a second stage housing opportunity for women who have completed a stay within the Native Women's Transition Centre and are moving towards independent living in the community.
- ✓ Ma Mawi Wi Chi Itata Centre who offers a broad range of community and residential based supports and programming. Ma Mawi's administrative offices and program offices are currently located at 94 McGregor, with a scheduled move to the former MPI building (King and Dufferin) by the summer of 2011.
- ✓ The Indian and Metis Friendship Centre which offers a number of program activities for youth and adults.
- ✓ The Lord Selkirk Park Resource Centre that provides family supports, child care and access to the adjacent adult education programming.
